How Kindness Can Make a Difference

I was just calling because I had to share my experience with you on Saturday at the Essentials Drive-Thru event. I'm a 60-year-old single mom of an autistic son, who also has some significant health issues. After a long-term marriage, and a not so good divorce, I was left as the sole supporter of my son. I've been living month-to-month with basically an almost-totaled car. This virus has put me out of work, not eligible for unemployment, and really feeling desperate. I have no family and a few friends, but I just have to thank you for Saturday. I cannot tell you what it did for me and my son, not just for the food and the wonderful essential items, but for my spirit. I came to the event, and I can't tell you how wonderful it was and how grateful I am. I've gone to only one other charity bank. While there, I waited hours and hours, which I gladly did, with no air conditioner in my car. I received very few items that I was able to use and most of the stuff was spoiled produce—it cost more for me to go there than what I received. So, I didn't have high expectations for your event, but I was so happy with the quality food and the essential items we received. It made a huge difference for my son and I. I'm so grateful. I also received the most kind, loving words. Somebody prayed with me and everyone was so happy—like truly, truly happy to be there. I couldn't thank them enough. I was crying behind my mask and waving and thanking everyone, and I just had to tell you what a difference it made . . . such a difference. I'm so grateful. Most of my life I've been on the giving end. I was a social worker for 20 years in South Florida, and after having a special needs son, my life has been about giving to others. I have a strong faith, but this was really the first time I needed someone. I just had to tell you how grateful I am. Everyone made us feel so special and not bad about being in line. So thank you again, so much. I really appreciate it. Thank you.




Melodie Woods is a great example of someone who was burdened by the need and got in the story! Melodie leads a team from the West Boca campus and consistently serves The Encore at Boca Raton Rehabilitation and Nursing Center. She started the ministry at Encore after her husband passed away while in rehab there. In a time of grief, she allowed God to bring her peace and transform her purpose as a new season bloomed. While the pandemic brought much loss and grief to the world, Melodie remembered the transforming power of God to bring peace and purpose out of darkness! She and her team brought food to the 30 staff members from The Grill in addition to two DVD players with Pastor Doug's Good Friday and Easter messages, two cases of chocolate, and some plaques with Scripture for the residents. Afterwards, Melodie received a text from the head director expressing gratitude on behalf of the staff saying, "This is the first time anyone other than management has recognized us."

Since then, the fruit of their generosity has been seen amongst the residents. Melodie received a call from Encore's activity director requesting a Bible on behalf of a resident. She quickly dropped off not one, but four large print Bibles for any of the residents who wanted one. "God has gotten me out of my comfort zone, and it gave me an opportunity to show my love and compassion for the elderly," she shared.









YOU'RE NEVER TOO YOUNG TO LEAD SOMEONE TO JESUS

As foster parents from our church openly welcome children in crisis into their homes, their primary concern is to provide a loving and safe home, one where they can share God's love. But sometimes, along the way, God can use even the most unsuspecting, younger hearts in a home to make an everlasting impact.

When foster parents Bryan and Jamie accepted a pair of siblings into their home, they graciously told them about Jesus, but what they didn't know was that in about three years, their 10-year-old biological son would lead their 8-year-old foster son to Christ! On Good Friday, their foster son admitted he had never asked Jesus to be his savior. While this burdened everyone's hearts, it especially impacted their biological son, Hilton. The following night, unable to sleep with the thought of his brother not knowing Jesus, Hilton went over to his room and asked him if he loved Jesus in his heart and believed He died for him. After wholeheartedly responding yes, climbing out of his bed, and getting on his knees, Hilton led his foster brother in the salvation prayer!

When Jamie went to say goodnight to Hilton, he excitedly told her the news! Speechless and in tears, Jamie left to tell her husband and praise God. When the youngest foster sibling, who had accepted Jesus a few months earlier, found out her brother had also been saved, she couldn't contain her joy! Little did she know her bold faith and love for Jesus would impact her older brother. Jamie shared that "she is one of the biggest evangelists you'll ever meet!"

Next on the agenda? Baptism! That very same week, all three kids started discussing when they could all get baptized together.



Jasiah's Story


Jasiah Moses was only 13 years old when his uncle—who cared for him like a son while his father was at Calvary House—passed away. As a result of this tragedy, Jasiah questioned his sense of identity and began to seek fulfillment in things like popularity and relationships. Although he was still attending church, his heart was hard and far from God.

Then one day, his mother encouraged him to go to The Landing, Celebrate Recovery's student ministry for middle and high school students. Jasiah immediately felt accepted and loved, saying, "Everyone there was so kind and inviting. It helped me release all of life's issues . . . It was a safe place."

After going to The Landing consistently, he went on a 21-day fast which God used to fill his heart with the Holy Spirit. Jasiah said it like this:

"What was empty before was now filled to the top and overflowing. My cup was running over."

A fire ignited within Jasiah that day to continue sharing the love and compassion of Christ with others and, as a result, he's now serving with The Landing! Jasiah shared, "God wants you to have a place where you can lay all of your problems at His feet and be set free. All you have to do is come."

17,007 participants joined to pray with viewers from various countries, including the United States, the Philippines, the United Kingdom, India, and Mexico



Peter, missionary in India, said . . .

Many friends and viewers reached out to me from different parts of the world, sharing how they felt the presence of God during OnePrayer.Global. A friend from Chicago who is a renowned architect shared that he grabbed his guitar and Bible and worshiped with us. He said he could feel the tangible presence of God. I'm here in India, you broadcasted from Fort Lauderdale, and someone in Chicago was touched and blessed, and there are many other stories like that from around the world. This is an amazing God moment we're a part of!



Revival Starts With You

In Guatemala, in the midst of a pandemic, God is stirring revival in the hearts of the men and women at Calvary Chapel La Esperanza. Here's what Pastor Jeff Stone shared . . .

The COVID-19 pandemic seems to have swept the world's normalcy away like an unexpected storm on a sunny day and dropped it upside down. Embracing hugs have converted into distant nods and the cold fear of infection has blotted out the warm community of social gatherings and confined many to their homes. La Esperanza, Guatemala, just like most of the world, has suffered the devastating economic and social effects that have accompanied this global health crisis. In many ways, the devastation has been much further reaching in third world countries such as Guatemala due to the substantial preexisting poverty and political unrest. In the midst of widespread fear and uncertainty, I stepped back as a pastor in prayer and asked God for guidance. From that prayer, God opened my eyes to see the great need for spiritual leadership in the home, and along with it a lens to see this upside down world right side up. Perhaps this abrupt loss of "normal" is God's way of getting our attention and an opportunity to focus on what's really important.

FOLLOWING JESUS DAILY, NOT JUST ON SUNDAY

The immediate halt of all church services revealed a spiritually malnourished church that was overdependent upon the pastor and the building instead of being

dependent upon the Good Shepherd Himself, Jesus Christ. Tragically, somewhere along the way we've concluded that following Jesus is something only done at church publicly instead of something that stems from a personal relationship and worship of Jesus privately. In 1 John 2:6 (NKJV) it wonderfully and simply expresses

what it means to

as He walked."

Imagine literally following Jesus on the beach. Wherever He walks you walk, just like a child strategically placing his tiny feet in the larger than life footsteps of his loving Father. Now this brings us to a very important point: In order to walk like Jesus, we must know Jesus personally and intimately, which comes through the reading of His word, prayer, and worship. Jesus calls us to follow Him daily, not just on Sunday.

This leads us to conclude that the real majority of our relationship with Jesus takes place throughout relationship with Him.

Unfortunately, we have a tendency to subcontract the spiritual care of our children and families to pastors and Sunday school teachers, while neglecting our God-given responsibility to lead through the practical worship of God in our homes. We justify pouring our lives into work all in the name of providing, when in reality the greatest thing we can provide for our families is spiritual leadership—taking them by the hand so they can follow Jesus



the week in our hearts and homes, making spiritual leadership in the home vitally necessary. If you want to be a part of truly changing the world, start in your home. True revival begins when we come back into rhythm with God's heart to have a vibrant and raw

with us. God designed the family unit to be a microcosm of His Church with authority, community, and loving devotion to Him. God did not call us to know and follow Him at appointed times throughout the week, but to know and experience Him personally in our daily lives.

RETURN TO COMFORT OR RESPOND TO CHANGE?

Returning to the present situation, we find ourselves challenged with a "new normal," but we must not fail to see God's gracious hand at work. Where many see a challenge to return to the way things used to be, we see a challenge to change and an opportunity to refocus on discipleship where it matters most, in the home. We believe that God is forging a new path and calling us to go where we

have never gone before and has given us everything we need to get there. Utilizing a network of small groups, we've launched a movement that centers around daily Bible readings and church at home emphasizing the family unity and devotion to God. The countless testimonies about how men and women are stepping up to shepherd their families spiritually are awe-inspiring.

One man, Juan, after doing a Sunday Bible study with his family said, "I can hardly believe what just happened, it seems like for the first time I was spiritually leading my family. My mother-in-law, who is Catholic, even came to listen and thanked me afterward for sharing God's Word." Another woman, Liz, made this comment about her husband Jonatan, "My husband and I have been going

to church for 14 years and recently for the first time I can really see him teaching and leading our family into a more intimate relationship with Jesus through His Word."

FOLLOWING JESUS FIRST

Juan and Jonatan are only two of many brave men and women who have stepped forward to make God the center of their home and family. Now, not only are we seeing Jesuscentered families, but we're seeing a greater desire being birthed in these households to go out and be the hands and feet of Christ in the community. With the help of numerous families, we were able to pass out hundreds of bags of food to impoverished families and share the message of hope in Jesus. This is undoubtedly a challenging season, but with every challenge comes an even greater opportunity. In John 10:27 (NKJV) Jesus said, "My sheep hear My voice, and I know them, and they follow Me."

Can you hear Jesus' voice in the midst of this challenge? He is saying "Follow me-not just at church on Sunday or by listening to a teaching online, but every day, with every step and every breath in your homes and hearts.

There is a revival taking place here in La Esperanza to make Jesus the center of our lives and homes, and we want to ask you to stand up and be a part of it. Take your families by the hand and show them what it means to have a personal relationship with Jesus. Sit them down today, open the Bible, bow your heads in prayer and say, "It's time to make a change." The revival starts with you.

Raising World Changers:

Discipleship at Every Stage

Jesus never discriminated according to age. His apostles ranged from teens to young adults and, even then, He encouraged them to have faith like a child. In view of this, we believe God intended discipleship to occur at every stage of life—from childhood to adulthood! Calvary strives to equip disciples of all ages to shine Christ's light among their generation!



Janice Harley of our Calvary Kids ministry shared a few stories that convey exactly why this is so . . .

Power of Salvation

At the end of our Salvation and Baptism Class in May, after everyone had logged off, one mom stayed behind and shared that her son wanted to receive Jesus, but she didn't know how to help him do that. So, she asked Nick Waskom, our 4th and 5th grade leader, if he would lead her son in a prayer for salvation! So, Nick asked the mom to pray while he led her son in a prayer to receive Jesus into his heart and to be his Savior!



Power of Community-Even Online!

In mid-May, during a parent team meeting with a few 4th and 5th grade parents, a mom shared that for the first time ever, her son had finally experienced an intimate small group, found friends, and felt like he belonged! I asked, "Wait, so you're saying that through the Zoom small groups, your son has found a more personal, intimate small group than he did when he met in the classroom on campus?" She said, "Yes!" Then, another mom spoke up and said, "It's the same with my daughter!" The response and impact of the Zoom groups have been so great that parents want to see them continue even after everything reopens. Many of the parents are even planning play dates throughout the summer!



Youth Ministry

This year, our youth ministries have seen around 80 first-time decisions for Christ! And by the grace of God, the pandemic hasn't slowed down the discipleship happening in Six78 (our middle school ministry) and HSM (our high school ministry) as online teachings have been viewed 2,108 times, with an average of 80 students participating in Zoom groups each week! Additionally, over 20,000 people have subscribed to more than 10 YouVersion plans that our very own middle and high school ministry staff have written—four of those plans include student contributors!

Finding Community In an Unexpected Way

Demetria, an HSM senior, began attending her senior group more consistently through the online platform and found the community her heart was longing for. Javan Shashaty, our high school youth pastor, said this about her experience:

She came to HSM sparingly before the pandemic, but she is all in now. She said she's excited and happy all day each Wednesday because she has the Zoom call to look forward to that night. After she graduates, she wants to come back and lead a small group in HSM!



Despite in-person services being suspended because of COVID-19, the young adults at Eikon have found an even greater sense of community with one another. Growing to over 12 active small groups and twice as many leaders, these young adults are digging into God's Word weekly and doing life together!




Our Calvary Kids content experienced over 80,400 views with 650 new subscribers (a 140% increase from last year).


More than **4,800** kids gathered to worship across all of our campuses.

A Place for Introductions:

HOW ALPHA IS INTRODUCING STUDENTS TO THEIR SAVIOR

Ann, who got in the story as a middle school small group leader taking her girls through Alpha, shared this via e-mail:

My reason for this e-mail is to share what happened tonight. We have a student who just started coming, and she's a great example of why Alpha works. She was invited by another student who ironically usually seems disinterested, but keeps coming back. She shared she doesn't really understand prayer and she thinks God doesn't like her. Her experience with her family's religion has been a list of rules and things you have to do.

Throughout the group time, she asked questions like 'What do you pray to God about?' 'How do you pray?' 'How do you know He hears you?' At the end of our time together, Tammy and I stayed behind to talk to her alone. We encouraged her to take a Bible since she didn't have one and to pray God would reveal Himself to her. We also explained His pursuit for her heart and that she doesn't have to do anything to gain His love. I'm praying that not only will God reveal Himself to her and ultimately bring her to salvation, but that she'll be the catalyst to also introduce her parents to a relationship with Christ!


